Announcing CIFF's 2023 Jury Award Winners!

Calgary, AB - The Calgary International Film Festival has welcomed 17 celebrated and revered voices in film communities from around the world to serve on the 2023 Jury to recognize this year's most exceptional feature and short films, which are currently screening until October 1, 2023.

With 12 awards and over \$60,000 CAD in cash and prizes, plus one winning short gaining eligibility for Academy Awards consideration, CIFF is proud to announce this year's winners!

RBC Emerging Canadian Artist Award (\$10,000 CAD)

This juried award is given to the Canadian director who creates the best first or second narrative feature film. Presented by RBC.

Grand Jury Prize: HUMANIST VAMPIRE SEEKING CONSENTING SUICIDAL PERSON, directed by Ariane Louis-Seize

With a singular vision and strong performances, HUMANIST VAMPIRE SEEKING CONSENTING SUICIDAL PERSON's mixture of comedy, drama, and horror was handled with impressive skill by this exciting emerging filmmaker! The jury was drawn into and excited by her world and characters both emotionally and cinematically.

This juried award is given to the Canadian director who creates the best documentary in the section. Presented by the Directors Guild of Canada. **Jury members:** Jon Joffe, Elizabeth Klinck, and Laura O'Grady

Grand Jury Prize: SWAN SONG, directed by Chelsea McMullan

This is a truly impressive performance documentary that moves away from traditional tropes with a cinema verité approach focusing on fantastic characters. The filmmaker's inspired choices make it a documentary for today and tomorrow.

Special Jury Prize: SUMMER QAMP, directed by Jen Markowitz

Best International Narrative Feature Award (\$1,000 CAD)

This juried award is given to the international director who creates the best narrative cinema from around the globe.

Grand Jury Prize: ANIMALIA, directed by Sofia Alaoui

This film draws you in with an urgency of storytelling and riveting imagery. The blending of the spiritual and the otherworldly is at once gripping and nuanced. Its commentary on social class and women's place in society combined with beautiful cinematography, impressive world-building, and visceral and organic visual effects, creates a stunning first feature that demands attention.
